## Text of Legislative File O-1112-24

#### Body

**<u>BACKGROUND</u>**: During the last legislative session, House Bill 1575 was introduced that would have allowed and regulated the use of gray water for the first time in Oklahoma. The original language was substituted prior to adoption, and the adopted language only added a definition of gray water to Section 2-6-107 in Title 27A. The adopted language reads:

A. "Gray water" means untreated household wastewater that has not come in contact with toilet waste and includes wastewater from bathtubs, showers, washbasins, clothes washing machines and laundry tubs and untreated municipal wastewater limited to wastewater captured from municipal splash pads and water used by Fire Departments for cleaning equipment and vehicles. Gray water shall not include wastewater from kitchen sinks, kitchen dishwashers, or laundry water from the washing of material soiled with human excreta, such as diapers.

B. The definition of gray water in subsection A of this section shall apply *only in municipalities enacting ordinances regulating the use of gray water* within the limits of their municipal boundaries. (*Emphasis* added).

Essentially, the Legislature allowed the municipalities to develop their own regulations for gray water. The issue of Norman allowing for and regulating the use of gray water was discussed at the City Council Study Session on January 3, 2012. A draft of Ordinance No. O-1112-24 was presented at the City Council Conference on January 24, 2012 and Staff was instructed to move the ordinance forward to Council for enactment.

**DISCUSSION**: Ordinance No. O-1112-24 would codify the definition of gray water set forth in the statutory provision quoted above. The ordinance would allow a private residential user to discharge up to 250 gallons of gray water per day for the purposes of household gardening, composting or landscape irrigation, provided that the resident takes certain steps to ensure the gray water is utilized in a safe manner. If gray water is not discharged in accordance with the provisions of the ordinance, a property owner could be charged and fined in Municipal Court.

Staff envisions conducting a public education campaign in conjunction with the Environmental Control Advisory Board (ECAB) to ensure residents who wish to use their gray water do so in a manner that is consistent with the provisions of the ordinance.

**<u>STAFF RECOMMENDATION</u>**: Staff recommends adoption of O-1112-24 upon Second Reading.
