MISCELLANEOUS DISCUSSION

Land Use. Mr. Evan Dunn, 1014 Missouri, apologized to Council for not always directing his comments to Council as a whole. He said he would like to address an issue regarding the City's land use policy including how the City can maximize the productive use of the land. Mr. Dunn said it is his belief that public space should be used more efficiently and an incredible amount of City resources are used to manage public space whether it is maintenance of equipment, labor costs and/or fuel expenses. He suggested some of Norman's public space could be converted to food forth-like settings if public space was designed in accordance with perma-culture principles, which would involve planting useful fruit and nut trees and integrating an urban agriculture system to that public space.

Industrial Hemp. Mr. Evan Dunn, 1014 Missouri, displayed three (3) products that were derived from imported industrially grown hemp, which is currently illegal to cultivate in the United States. He said hemp is drought hardy, can help farmers, and the domestic cultivation would likely create jobs. Mr. Dunn said he wanted to be clear that he is not advocating the legalization of marijuana. He contacted Congressmen Cole and Coburn, Senators Inhoff and Standridge, and House Representatives Virgin and Stiles because he felt legalizing this product deserves consideration. He said he would personally and enthusiastically endorse any symbolic proclamation that established or expressed support for the legalization of the cultivation of industrial hemp and would encourage anybody in their conversations with friends, family, and other legislators to broach this subject, gather opinions, and form their own ideas.

Agenda Materials. Ms. Ann Gallagher, 1522 East Boyd Street, said Staff does an incredible job of gathering necessary materials for Council and putting together presentations, but often material comes at the last minute. She realized that on some occasions this could not be helped, but still felt it is not fair to Council and/or to the citizens of Norman to push those particular agenda items forward without being able to study and/or ask questions.

Citizens Police Academy. Ms. Ann Gallagher, 1522 East Boyd Street, said she was able to attend the graduation ceremony tonight for Class Three of the Citizens Police Academy and commended Staff for the continuation of this program, especially to Chief Humphrey, Captain David Teuscher, Sergeant Tim Smith, Sergeant Jennifer Newell, and Officer Teddy Wilson as well as the entire Police Department. She encouraged citizens to apply for Class Four and said applications are available on the City's website on the Norman Police Department page and are being taken now.

Meeting Decorum. Ms. Ann Gallagher, 1522 East Boyd Street, reminded Councilmembers and the citizens to use kind words when speaking during the meetings.

*

Crematorium Ordinance. Mr. Hal Ezzell, 518 Chautauqua, said this was the first time he has approached Council to request an ordinance change, as a citizen, since he stepped down as Ward 3 Councilmember. He said it is very different on this side of the dais and sometimes the citizen/applicant's perspective is forgotten. Mr. Ezzell said tonight's actions have given him a renewed appreciation and thanked Council for their service. He said he appreciated the opportunity to speak to Councilmembers at their homes, workplaces, etc., in regards to educating them about why Norman needed a crematorium ordinance. He appreciated Council's consideration and the sacrifice of their time when considering Council matters. He said he also appreciated Ms. Susan Connors, Director of Planning and Community Development, and her Staff with regards to the hard work done in developing this ordinance and said Staff is very capable and professional. Mr. Ezzell said tonight has reminded him how very well Council and Staff take care of business in the City of Norman.

Item 40, Miscellaneous Discussion, continued:

Homelessness. Mr. Stephen Tyler Holman, 1030 South College Avenue, said he raised concerns at the last meeting regarding the homeless situation in Norman and he received a very quick response from the City. He said he was informed Food and Shelter for Friends started opening the inside of their building the end of October, but felt that is only a band-aid to a bigger issue that continues to grow and will have to be dealt with in the future. Mr. Holman said he appreciated all the special services Norman provides with limited resources and appreciated the Councilmembers who looked into this matter.

Football. Mr. Stephen Tyler Holman, 1030 South College Avenue, said even though he is a graduate of Norman High School, he will support the Norman North Timberwolves this Friday, November 30, 2012, by traveling to Stillwater to watch them compete for the 6A State Football Championship and encouraged everyone to do the same. Mr. Holman said he hoped that the Tigers and Timberwolves could come together as a community to support Norman North and wished the Timberwolves the best of luck.

Councilmember Williams congratulated Norman North for being in the 6A State Championship game. Although he was unable to attend, he encouraged others to do so and said the game begins at 7:30 p.m. at Boone Pickens Stadium in Stillwater.

Councilmember Castleberry congratulated the Norman North Football Team for making it to the 6A State Football Championship game. He said the Norman North Football Booster Club is sponsoring charter buses to the game. He said they are selling t-shirts and any financial support that can be given would be greatly appreciated. Councilmember Castleberry said his firm has happily supported Norman North Booster Club financially and encouraged everyone to do the same.

Mayor Rosenthal congratulated the Norman North Timberwolves as well and thanked the University of Oklahoma football team for beating West Virginia so that she did not have to wear a West Virginia t-shirt during the Council meeting tonight. She said it is great when citizens rally around the various teams within our community.

United Way of Norman. Councilmember Williams thanked everyone who participated in No-Shave November supporting the United Way and bringing awareness to men's health.

Shop Norman. Councilmembers Griffith and Castleberry reminded everyone to shop Norman.

Honoring Veterans. Councilmember Spaulding expressed his appreciation to Mayor Rosenthal for beginning the meeting with a moment of silence to honor those veterans who lost their lives in a tragic accident during a Veterans Day Parade in Midland, Texas. He said he contacted her to ask what Council could do to support them during their time of loss and she prepared a Mayoral proclamation which was forwarded to the Mayor of Midland expressing Norman's deepest condolences.

Sidewalks. Councilmember Castleberry was excited that Agenda Item 11 passed, which is the annual Sidewalk Improvements Project. He said this contract will finish a sidewalk on 48th Avenue that former Councilmember Ezzell began about five (5) years ago. Councilmember Castleberry said he asked Mr. Ezzell if there was anything in particular he needed to know about Ward 3 before being appointed and Mr. Ezzell said get the sidewalk on 48th Avenue N.W. finished.

Game Day Traffic. Councilmember Castleberry said he is upset with the traffic control situation after the University of Oklahoma (OU) football games and would like to meet with the appropriate person to discuss this further. He said better traffic control is needed if Boyd Street continues to be closed during OU Football games.

Monroe Park Dedication. Councilmember Kovach thanked Councilmembers Williams, Castleberry, and Jungman and Mayor Rosenthal for attending the opening of Monroe Park.

Charter Review Commission. Councilmember Kovach thanked the citizens, many who have served before, who are participating in Charter Review Commission and said it was a very important task. Councilmember Kovach said the Charter is the City's founding/fundamental document and he looks forward to the work they will produce.
