<u>Legacy Park Update</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, provided an update of construction at Legacy Park. He provided pictures of the installation of the Entry Columns for the park and the control room vaults that were delivered last week from Delta Manufacturing in Florida. He said the vaults will be installed underground and will contain pump equipment to operate the fountains. He said it is hoped Legacy Park will be completed sometime in August, 2014.

Griffin Park. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said there are currently four lit soccer fields in Griffin Park and last week bids opened that will allow three additional fields to be lit. He said this project is being done cooperatively between the City and the Norman Youth Soccer Association (NYSA). NYSA provided \$80,000 in private donations to help advance the project. This work will start during winter months to be ready for Spring Soccer Season.

Lake Thunderbird Total Maximum Daily Load Study (TMDL). Staff has received notification from the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality that the Environmental Control Protection Agency has completed the TMDL which will prompt the City to begin extensive work to complete a compliance plan to monitor and track pollutants that go into Lake Thunderbird. He said staff is working together to bring forth recommendations as to how to come into compliance.

The Passing of Cody Ponder. Mayor Rosenthal expressed her sadness at the passing of Cody Ponder,

Community Leader and Volunteer. She said Cody died early this afternoon after a lengthy battle with Esophageal Cancer and our prayers go out to him and his family.
