

## **ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW**

CommunityWorks, LLC is a privately owned and operated Oklahoma company which has been in business since 2000. The nationally accredited corporation is operated from its corporate offices in Norman, Oklahoma.

The governing and advisory boards of CommunityWorks are comprised of a multidisciplinary team of healthcare professionals, including a psychiatrist, psychologist, registered nurse and licensed professional counselors.

The professional staff at CommunityWorks is committed to individualized care and treatment for each of their clients to optimize every opportunity for successful outcomes

The highly qualified professionals hold specialized degrees and are trained in innovative methods and treatments. Services are confidential and are offered unconditionally, regardless of race, religion, gender, age or income. In addition to weekday hours, there are evening appointments offered at some locations.

CommunityWorks accepts most major insurance carriers as well as a sliding fee scale for those who qualify and need assistance.

Currently, the agency has offices and programs in Norman, Moore, Noble, Midwest City and Spencer and provides outpatient therapy, PCIT, rehabilitation services, mental health assessments, DUI assessments, parenting classes and anger management classes. In addition, CW's School Based Program is providing services in more than a dozen schools in the Oklahoma City, Midwest City, Norman, and Noble. CommunityWorks sponsors an 11-week summer program for students in the Noble community.

CommunityWorks also manages the Cleveland County Regional Juvenile Detention Facility and the Pottawatomie County Juvenile Detention Facility (Carter Hall) as well as operates a Level E Group Home in Spencer, Oklahoma.



## CommunityWorks 12 BED ACUTE CARE UNIT

The Acute Care Unit will accommodate 12 children ages 6 to 14 years of age, both male and female. The psychiatric in-patient facility will be unique to the state in model and design bringing the highest standards of trauma focused treatment to the children of Oklahoma. The program will offer intensive services for emotionally and behaviorally impaired children and their families in crisis. The children and families will interact with a multi-disciplinary team of specially trained professionals, including psychiatrists, nurses, therapists, teachers and behavioral rehabilitative specialists.

Children admitted to the facility will typically be at great risk and can no longer be maintained in a less restrictive environment. The program will offer a secure (locked), safe and structured living environment necessary for treatment of children as they receive needed professional supervision and interventions. The program goals include helping the children regain safe and effective functioning, prepare them for re-entry into their homes and community environments and provide sound and practical coordination of resources for continuing care upon discharge.

The program will emphasize bio-psycho-social evaluation in a child-centered environment. Treatment will be determined utilizing a collaborative problem solving method with parents, community providers, educators and appropriate state agencies. We will work to identify the child's individualized problems related to trauma and work toward an individualized plan for treatment.

Available services while in the program will include:

Medical evaluation and diagnosis
Bio-psycho-social evaluation
Education
Individual therapy
Group therapy
Family therapies
Recreational therapies
Nutritional consultation
Pharmacological consultation
Psychological evaluations
Medications

Coordination of treatment and aftercare plans with community providers and state agencies.

The environment of the facility will be state of the art and child friendly. However, due to the nature of the acute condition of the children upon admission, the facility must remain locked and secure at all times to maintain a safe treatment environment for the children.

The predictive average length of stay in the facility would be 14 to 30 days.
