
I am in FULL SUPPORT of adding the 400 block of College Ave. to the CHD.


Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am writing in support of an Ordinance to expand the Chautauqua Historic District (CHD) by designating property generally located in the 400 block of College Avenue between Boyd Street and Symmes Street as an Historic District Overlay. The Commission will be considering the petition by residents of the 400 block of College Avenue at your meeting on July 12, 2018.

As President of the Chautauqua Historic District Neighborhood Association, I offer the full support of the members of our association to expand the Chautauqua Historic District to include the 400 block of College. The CHD Neighborhood Association was formed and incorporated in 1994 and the CHD was established in 1995. This will be the first opportunity to expand the CHD since that time. The 400 block of College has a high percentage of contributing (historically significant) structures still intact and the neighborhood itself has played an important role in the early story of Norman. This block meets all the criteria necessary to be included in the CHD.
