PROJECT GOAL:

To reduce the number of KAB crashes in Norman by 2% annually, from 361 in 2010 to 340 in 2013.

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION:

The city of Norman, which encompasses 190 square miles, is located a short distance south of Oklahoma City in Cleveland County. Within its jurisdiction is a major lake and one of the largest universities in the state.

The population in the City of Norman continues to grow, currently with more than 111,000 year-round residents, and an additional 20,000+ transient population associated with the University of Oklahoma. Of this number, almost 4,000 are high school students. As a result, many of the city's drivers are young and inexperienced. Often these young drivers make the poor choice of driving after they have had too much to drink. Increased enforcement and education are needed to discourage impaired driving and encourage better choices.

Results of the initial Seat Belt Survey conducted in November of 2010, indicated a positive overall compliance rate for the City of Norman at 91.2%, with daytime compliance at 92.9% and night time compliance at 89.4%; however, a late evening compliance check conducted in the city after nine o'clock PM indicated only 76% compliance. The discrepancy in late evening compliance rates would tend to indicate that increased education and later evening enforcement activities may be necessary to increase consistent use of occupant restraints.

In 2011, the City of Norman reported 5 fatalities and 676 injury collisions, which represents a significant reduction compared to the 9 fatalities and 836 injury collisions reported in 2008. Compared to the 13 fatalities and 906 injury collisions reported in 2004, this represents a 61% reduction in fatalities and a 25% reduction in injury collisions during this 7-year span. Funding provided through previous grants has enabled the city to expand traffic enforcement efforts and increase public awareness. The implementation of motorcycles is expected to enhance efficiency in working traffic and increase citizen satisfaction with the duties being performed by local police officers.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Norman Police Department will implement activities in support of national highway safety goals and target violators that contribute to the causes and severity of motor vehicle crashes.

Using the appropriate funding source, this project will target occupant protection enforcement in an effort to decrease KAB crashes. Project officers will also utilize overtime pay for impaired driving enforcement, and will participate in overtime enforcement activities for the combined occupant protection and impaired driving project.

Overtime assignments will be focused on locations and times where high incidents of KAB crashes are likely to occur. Public information and education events will be conducted to inform the public of traffic safety issues and related events occurring in the city.

Enforcement waves conducted during the combined occupant protection and impaired driving project will take place during the months of November, April, and July/August. Norman PD will be responsible for scheduling appropriate overtime shifts between 1500 and 0300 hours during each wave, collecting enforcement activity from each wave, and reporting enforcement activity online.

In addition, the Norman Police Department will coordinate plans and host the IPTM Collision Reconstruction Course. The course will be taught by instructors from the Institute of Police Technology and Management (IPTM), and will be offered to approximately thirty (30) students, consisting of officers from partner agencies within the Oklahoma City metropolitan area.

The Norman Police Department will also support NHTSA's national initiatives by participating in the *Click-It or Ticket* mobilization and the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* crackdown, including pre- and post-mobilization/crackdown reporting.

EQUIPMENT JUSTIFICATION:

Sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) has been allocated for the purchase of two, fully-equipped police motorcycles in support of this project. The two motorcycles will be utilized exclusively to work traffic enforcement. Purchase of the motorcycles will be in compliance with the purchasing/inventory policies of the City of Norman and the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office. (Note: Approval of equipment is contingent upon NHTSA's approval of the Oklahoma Highway Safety Plan. Equipment should not be purchased until a letter of approval from NHTSA has been received.)

EVALUATION:

At the conclusion of the project year, and no later than November 1, 2013, the Project Director will submit a Summary Report outlining the accomplishments and deficits of the project and will compare results to initial baseline data (2010) to determine whether the project's goals were met.

5. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion – Lower Tier Covered Transactions:

3. Maintain equipment until Grantee receives letter of approval.
4. Return Equipment to OHSO

SPECIFIC AGREEMENTS – PART III

Grantee shall adopt (if none presently exists) and enforce a safety belt use policy requiring all employees and others riding in Grantee vehicles and/or on Grantee business to use safety belts in accordance with State law.

Regular compensation and/or overtime compensation provided in this grant award will be paid in accordance with established policies and regulations of your entity. Any deviation from the established policies and regulations must be specifically addressed in the written grant award.

Grantee shall verify that any officer using a grant purchased radar or grant purchased video camera has received training in the proper use of the equipment.

Grantee shall encourage all law enforcement officers participating in impaired driving enforcement programs to obtain certification in NHTSA sanctioned Standard Field Sobriety Test (SFST) procedures.

Grantee shall submit monthly activity and reimbursement reports (including all appropriate documentation) to OHSO. Reports shall be submitted within 30 days of the end of the reporting month. Failure to comply with this 30-day limit may result in denial of the reimbursement claim.

Reports should include, as a minimum, the following:

1. Project Director's Report.
2. Budget Summary (include all cumulative year-to-date information).
3. Budget Details (include all cumulative year-to-date information).
4. Activity Milestones (include all cumulative year-to-date information).
5. Financial documentation for the current report (time sheets, payroll documents, invoices, purchase orders, and/or other appropriate verification of expenditures).
6. Activity documentation for the current report (include information on all projected activities whether completed or not, and any additional activities that were conducted; an explanation should be provided for any activities not completed).
7. Any additional, pertinent information to the project for the current reporting period.

This is a Federally funded project. The Federal Funds are provided by the NHTSA and, as such, may be subject to audit under Office of Management and Budget (OBM) or A-133. Unless other arrangements are made, any required audit is the responsibility of the Grantee.
