

Sec. 8-203. - Purchases: City Council approval.

The City Council must approve all contracts for, or purchases of, supplies, equipment, or contractual services, where the valuation exceeds twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00), prior to the signing of such contracts or the transaction of such purchases.

- (a) Excepted from the requirement of Council approval are the purchases of or contracts for:
 - (1) Supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services when purchased through state contracts.
 - (2) Emergency supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services which are necessary to maintain operations. Such purchases shall receive prior approval from the City Manager.

Sec. 8-204. - Competitive bidding required; exceptions.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, all purchases of, or contract for, supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services shall be made through competitive bidding.
- (b) Excepted from the requirement of competitive bidding are the purchases of or contracts for:
 - (1) Supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services whose cost in a single transaction does not exceed the minimum amount defined in the "Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974" as set forth in 61 O.S. § 102.
 - (2) Supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services which can be furnished only by a single dealer, or which have a uniform price wherever bought.
 - (3) Supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services purchased from another unit of government at a price deemed below that obtainable from private dealers, including war surplus.
 - (4) Supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services when purchased at a price not exceeding a price set therefor by the state purchasing agency or any other state agency authorized to set prices for things purchased by the state.
 - (5) Supplies, materials, equipment, or contractual services whose purchase is approved by the Council as necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, or safety.
 - (6) Contractual services of a professional nature, such as engineering, architectural, and medical services.
 - (7) Contractual services (gas, electricity, telephone service, etc.) purchased from a public utility at a price or rate determined by the State Corporation Commission or other government authority.
