#### **Cleveland County CASA Program Description**

Cleveland County CASA recruits, trains and supervises community volunteers to serve as Court Appointed Special Advocates for children who are adjudicated "deprived" due to child abuse and/or neglect and have been made wards of the court.

Child abuse and neglect is a significant issue in our state—Oklahoma consistently ranks in the top five states for rates of child abuse and neglect, and our community is not immune. Only the most severe of these cases enter the court system. While there is no formal tracking of the number of children that fall under the jurisdiction of the court, there are usually between 300-350 children at the end of any given month who are living outside of their homes in foster homes, group homes, and other forms of placement. We estimate that there is an average of 500-700 children a year who are wards of the court in Cleveland County.

When a child enters the child welfare system, he/she enters it virtually alone. Due to the mere size of the bureaucratic state agencies and the court system, children often fall through the cracks of the very system put in place to protect them. Child welfare workers, overloaded with caseloads of 60-90 children, operate from crisis to crisis and rarely have the time to give each case the attention it needs to move children out of the limbo of foster care and into a permanent home in a timely manner. As a result, children are often moved from foster home to foster home without getting needed services, resulting in children more damaged than when they were removed from the home in the first place. Studies of former foster children show that they experience higher rates of homelessness, incarceration, teen pregnancy, and reliance on public assistance as adults. Their time in the child welfare system impacts their long-term success as community members and citizens.

CASA was developed to remedy some of these shortcomings. Through his/her court order, the CASA has access to all the information that exists on the child and his or her family. The CASA researches the case background, interviews all parties and professionals, monitors progress toward case plan goals, and facilitates communication between professionals. The volunteer then submits written reports to the court and is present in court making recommendations representing what he/she believes to be in the best interest of the child. Otherwise, the judge has to make important decisions that impact these vulnerable children based on limited information. The CASA also presents recommendations to address the children's needs, such as a need for counseling, an educational evaluation, or even something as basic as clothing.

Perhaps most importantly, CASAs are also a source of stability and consistency to children who are experiencing nothing but uncertainty and change. The CASA is focused solely on the child and his/her best interests, without an inside stake in the case. Cases assigned a CASA receive literally hundreds of hours of attention that they would not receive if not appointed a CASA. In 2013, 80 Cleveland County CASA volunteers represented the best interests of 168 children. Cleveland County CASA is the only program providing this service to our community.

#### **Proposed Budget**

In previous years, Cleveland County CASA has approached and received funds from the Social and Voluntary Services Commission for assistance in training and screening new advocates. Standards set forth by the Oklahoma CASA Association and National CASA Association require all CASA volunteers to undergo screening and background checks that include; OSBI, MVR, and national background checks including a sex offender registry search and Mary Ripley Violent Crime search.

It is the goal of Cleveland County CASA to screen and train an additional 30 volunteers in the remainder of the 2015 fiscal year. These volunteers would provide advocacy services for an additional 40-45 children in our community who are wards of the court. There is no other program in our community that offers a similar service.

Through this application, Cleveland County CASA is requesting assistance in the area of Volunteer Training and Screening.
