Councilmember Miller said this initiative is not for any specific ward; however, it is for all ages and for the whole City. She said Ward Five is a big recipient even though the Eastside Library is not in Ward Five. The library location and Saxon Park will be easily accessed by all of the neighborhoods in Ward Five.

Councilmember Williams said he drove back from Dallas today from the annual Crimes Against Children Conference that he is attending all week because he wanted to take part in this historic vote. He said during his drive home, he reflected on all of the meetings about Norman Forward and was reminded that all the friction and the many discussions will make the projects and the City of Norman even better.

Councilmember Allison said he is excited about the election on October 13th.

Councilmember Castleberry thanked Council for all of the time they had devoted to Norman Forward. He said most of the issues had been worked through and appreciated meeting with the Senior Citizens to address their concerns. He said he is committed to having a Stand Alone Senior Citizens Center. He said Council has had their differences but they all agree they want Norman to be the best place to live and that Norman Forward will provide quality of life for Norman citizens. He encouraged everyone to go vote.

To address Mr. Hilliard's concerns, Councilmember Holman said currently Griffin Park, Sutton Wilderness, and Frances Cate Park are owned by the State of Oklahoma and the goal through Norman Forward is to purchase these properties from the State to allow them to stay as City parks forever.

Councilmember Holman said the Stand Alone Senior Citizen Center is the best idea if it is possible. He said for the facility to be in the Andrews Park area, additional property would need to be acquired and that is why an alternative was offered in the ordinance.

Councilmember Lang said he liked that citizens trusted City Council to make the right decisions about Norman Forward projects. He said if someone does not like what a Councilmember does, vote against them in the election.

Councilmember Jungman thanked the citizens who have worked so hard on Norman Forward especially the Senior Citizens. He said he is honored to be a very small part of it. He said there is a lot of hope and optimism for the voter turnout on October 13th.

<u>Respect to Speakers.</u> Mr. Bobby Stevens, Post Office Box 6226, said he had to address Council as a whole and not single any one Councilmember out and he wished that Council would have the same respect for the citizens when they speak to Council.

<u>Acres Avenue and Crawford Avenue Intersection.</u> Mr. Bobby Stevens, Post Office Box 6226, said road repairs were needed at the intersection of Acres Avenue and Crawford Avenue.

*

<u>Code Enforcement.</u> Mr. Bobby Stevens, Post Office Box 6226, said the Code Enforcement Division should take care of their own problems before hassling the citizens.

Councilmember Heiple thanked staff for working diligently to take care of all the code violations because there had been a lot of them.

Miscellaneous Discussion, continued:

<u>Citizen Support</u>. Ms. Ann Gallagher, 1522 East Boyd Street, said it was nice to have a full Council Chambers tonight even though everyone did not stay for the whole meeting. She said more people needed to be involved in all issues before Council. She said there are many new voters and she hoped they would vote more than one time. She said there needs to be civic pride and responsibility. She applauded the Senior Citizens for staying for the entire meeting.

Councilmember Miller thanked the Senior Citizens, Library supporters, and Medieval Fair supporters for staying until the end tonight.

<u>Citizen Support</u>. Ms. Ann Gallagher, 1522 East Boyd Street, said road repairs need to be done on Castlerock Road.

*

<u>Thanks to Public Works</u>. Councilmember Allison thanked the Public Works Department for helping him with issues from constituents.

*

<u>School Is Starting</u>, <u>Be Careful</u>. Councilmember Lang reminded everyone to please be careful because students will be starting school soon.

*

<u>Westwood Pool.</u> Mayor Rosenthal thanked the staff at Westwood Pool and the Norman Fire Department for acting quickly during a rescue at the pool averting a disaster. She said she really appreciated the training and supervision of the young people who staff the pool. She was glad that the Dog Dunking Party which is a tradition at Westwood Pool still was able to happen.

City Manager's Report

<u>Highway 9 Improvements</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, provided a photograph of the installation of columns for the Sound Wall on Highway 9 at 24th Avenue N.W.

He showed a photograph of ongoing construction of the Ed Noble Parkway Extension (28th Avenue S.W.), a new roadway connecting Highway 9 to Lindsey Street. He said this improvement is a key link for when the Lindsey Street Bridge is taken out of service to be reconstructed.

*

<u>Update on Infrastructure Damage</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, provided a map showing all of the street and bridge projects that have been addressed since the May severe weather. He said there were 64 total project locations (17 major and 47 minor) that are being repaired by the City of Norman using a combination of funding sources. He said all temporary roadway repairs are now complete. He said the only current road closure is at Post Oak Road between 108th Avenue S.E. and 120th Avenue S.E. Due to the extensive damage to this bridge, a temporary repair is not economical and it will remain closed until a new bridge can be designed and constructed with the help of the City's federal partners.

<u>Water Surcharge Fees</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said earlier this year, voters approved an increase in water rates which included an additional high usage surcharge of \$0.35 per thousand gallons of water used above 20,000 gallons in the months of July and August. He said this was done to encourage conservation and help offset extraordinary expenses for the purchase of water from other cities. He said the first set of bills with the surcharge included was sent out last week to the customer area roughly bounded by Lindsey Street on the south; Acres Street on the north; 12th Avenue on the east; and Berry Road on the west.

Miscellaneous Discussion, continued:

City Manager's Report, continued:

<u>Water Reclamation Facility Improvements</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said voters authorized approval of a rate increase for Water Reclamation Facility Improvements in 2013. He said construction of the improvements has been ongoing for 14 months and the facility is approximately 50% complete. He said the City was required by the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality to meet some of the latest state regulations which included disinfection with Ultra Violet Treatment and additional oxygen by Post Aeration. He said this critical milestone has to occur by January 1, 2016, and completion is anticipated in November, 2015.

He said during all the serious weather, oftentimes the Water Reclamation Facility has been without power. He said the new plant improvements include installation of five (5) new emergency electrical generators which gives the City the ability to treat wastewater throughout all kinds of weather conditions.

*

<u>August Sales Tax</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said the general purpose sales tax remittance for the month of August which reflects sales during the month of June is \$4,833,065. He said this is an increase of \$358,306 (+8.01%) from August 2014 levels. He said Fiscal year 2015-2016 sales tax receipts are now 2.54% above prior-year levels.
