

A PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, PROCLAIMING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 2017, AS BLACK HISTORY MONTH IN THE CITY OF NORMAN.

- § 1. WHEREAS, since its origin in 1926 as Black History Week, we as a nation, have paused to reflect on the many contributions of our African-American citizens that enrich our nation, state, and community; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, 2017's national theme, "The Crisis in Black Education," focuses on the crucial role of education in the history of African Americans, honors the centuries-old efforts of resistance to this crisis, encourages continued efforts to address this crisis, and promotes progress in this area as one of the most important goals in America's past, present, and future; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, the influence and accomplishments of African-American citizens have contributed to our community in all aspects of life, including the arts, education, business, religion, and sports and have continued to help make Norman a safe, thriving, and vibrant community; and
- § 4. WHEREAS, the City of Norman continues to strive to become a more inclusive community providing all citizens the right to human dignity, justice, and opportunity to live life fully and achieve their aspirations; and
- § 5. WHEREAS, the Norman Human Rights Commission continues to work to dispel prejudice and discrimination, and to advance fairness, mutual understanding and appreciation for the worth of all people.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA:

- § 6. Do hereby proclaim the month of February, 2017, as Black History Month in the City of Norman and invite all citizens to join me in celebrating the diversity and character of our community.
