MISCELLANEOUS DISCUSSION

City Council Salaries. Mr. Evan Dunn, 1014 Missouri Street, said the City Council only makes \$100 per month and he had attended several long City Council meetings and Committee meetings and that it takes many hours to be a City Councilmember. He said he appreciated all that Councilmembers do and he would support an increase in pay for Councilmembers.

Ms. Jeanette Coker, 620 East Main Street, said she had asked that Council appoint a task force to look into the expenses that Councilmembers incur while on Council, such as cell phone and gasoline expenses in addition to the time spent.

<u>Downtown Farmers Market</u>. Mr. Evan Dunn, 1014 Missouri Street, said a Downtown Farmers Market could be a way to make use of unused parking spaces in the City owned parking lot and would be a way to help surrounding communities sell produce and increase customers for downtown businesses.

Commercial Recycling. Mr. Evan Dunn, 1014 Missouri Street, said the contract with Waste Management for the curbside recycling program would be up for renewal soon and he suggested researching how much recycled material businesses generate. He said many businesses in high traffic areas generate a lot of waste and volunteers could monitor how much recycled material is produced on a working day versus a weekend day by intercepting and creating a log of what is used. He said this information could be provided to Waste Management to show there is a need.

Norman Transcript Article. Ms. Ann Gallagher, 1522 East Boyd Street, said an article was recently published in the Norman Transcript about roads under construction being opened up for the University of Oklahoma (OU) football traffic. She said many citizens were very upset by this wording because it was perceived that the City cared more about OU traffic than they did about the citizens of Norman.

High Density Dialogues. Ms. Cindy Rogers, 633 Reed Avenue, thanked the City for all of the High-Density Dialogues because they were very productive. She said she hoped Staff would take into consideration how this plan would affect the Norman 2025 Land Use and Transportation Plan as well as water usage and utilities.

God Bless Norman. Councilmember Spaulding said "God Bless Norman."

Shop Norman. Councilmember Griffith and Castleberry said "Shop Norman."

<u>Library Book Sale</u>. Councilmember Lockett reminded citizens about the Annual Book Sale at Norman Public Library on October 19th.

Bond Election. Councilmember Kovach expressed his appreciation to the Citizens Committee for working so hard and also to the voters for approving it. He said many of these issues have existed for a long time. He said the first time McGee/Lindsey was addressed was in 1970. He thanked Mr. Shawn O'Leary, Director of Public Works, who spoke at many meetings. He said it just shows that when you give the community a clear goal and clear need, they come together.

Miscellaneous Discussion, continued:

<u>Veteran's Parade</u>. Councilmember Gallagher announced the Veteran's Parade would be held on Sunday, November 11, 2012, to honor the returning 45th Infantry Division.

Constitution Week. Councilmember Gallagher said this is Constitution Week and the first ten amendments are very critical because they are there to insure the safety Americans have from an oppressive government. He said presently the United Nations is undergoing a persistent effort to try to eliminate small arms worldwide. He encouraged citizens to examine the first ten amendments and the freedoms citizens have and to obtain a pamphlet outlining and explaining these amendments.

Animal Shelter Project. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said the Animal Welfare Oversight Committee recently had a very productive meeting with the architects who were working on the remodeling and expansion of the Animal Shelter. He said Staff and the Animal Shelter Oversight Committee plan to bring to Council some preliminary plans at the end of October or in early November. He said it is hoped the project can be bid out no later than March, 2013.

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<u>Litter Control Program</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said the Litter Control Program had been reinstated and employees from Streets and Stormwater Division would begin working in high traffic areas and entryways into the community.

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Gray Street Parking Lot. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said the Phillips Building had been demolished at 121 South Peters Avenue; however, there is still quite a bit of work to be done such as paving, drainage, gutter work, lighting, and installation of the parking system. He said the new parking lot should be ready by November 1, 2012.

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<u>Sales Tax</u>. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said September sales tax figures had been received and there was a 4% increase over last year.
