

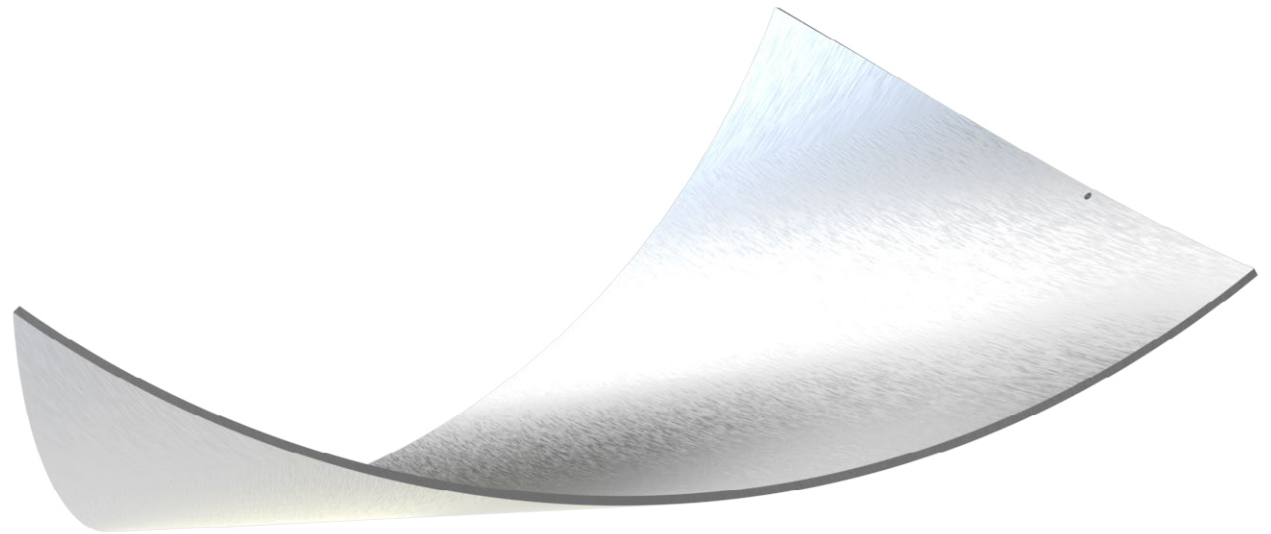






MATERIALITY

WHY REPRESENT PAPER

This piece connects with paper as an invention that changed the course of human history. Our sculpture pays homage to the millions of pieces of paper in the Norman library, but also emphasises our changing relationship with them.

That changing relationship makes this piece relevant not just for its obvious connections to the library, but as a milestone that marks the turning point of paper's role in our lives.

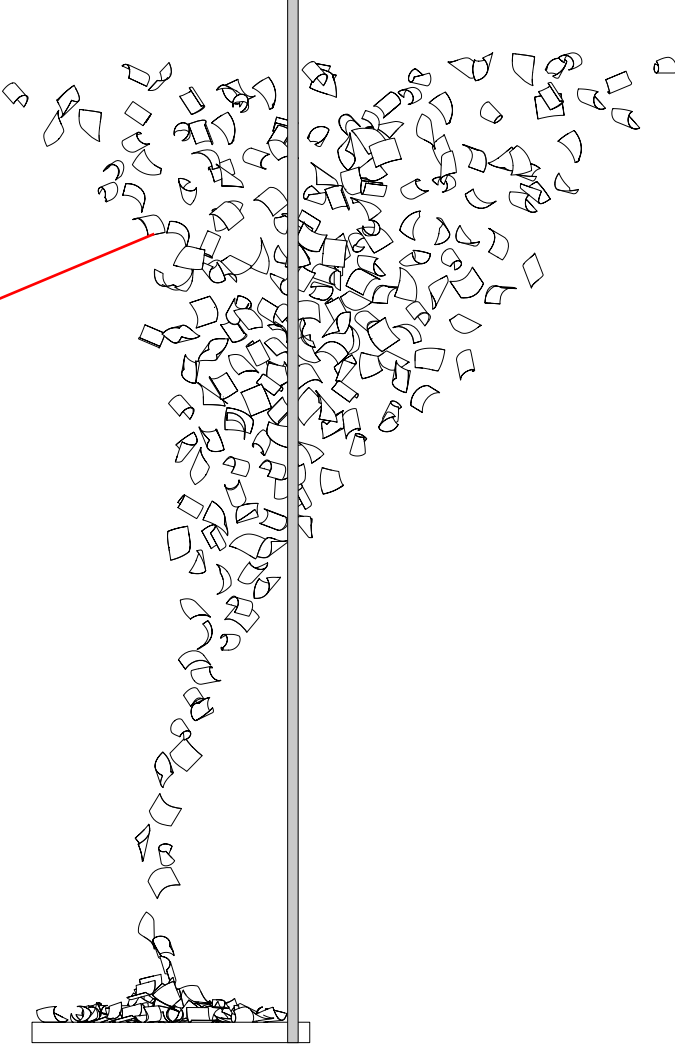

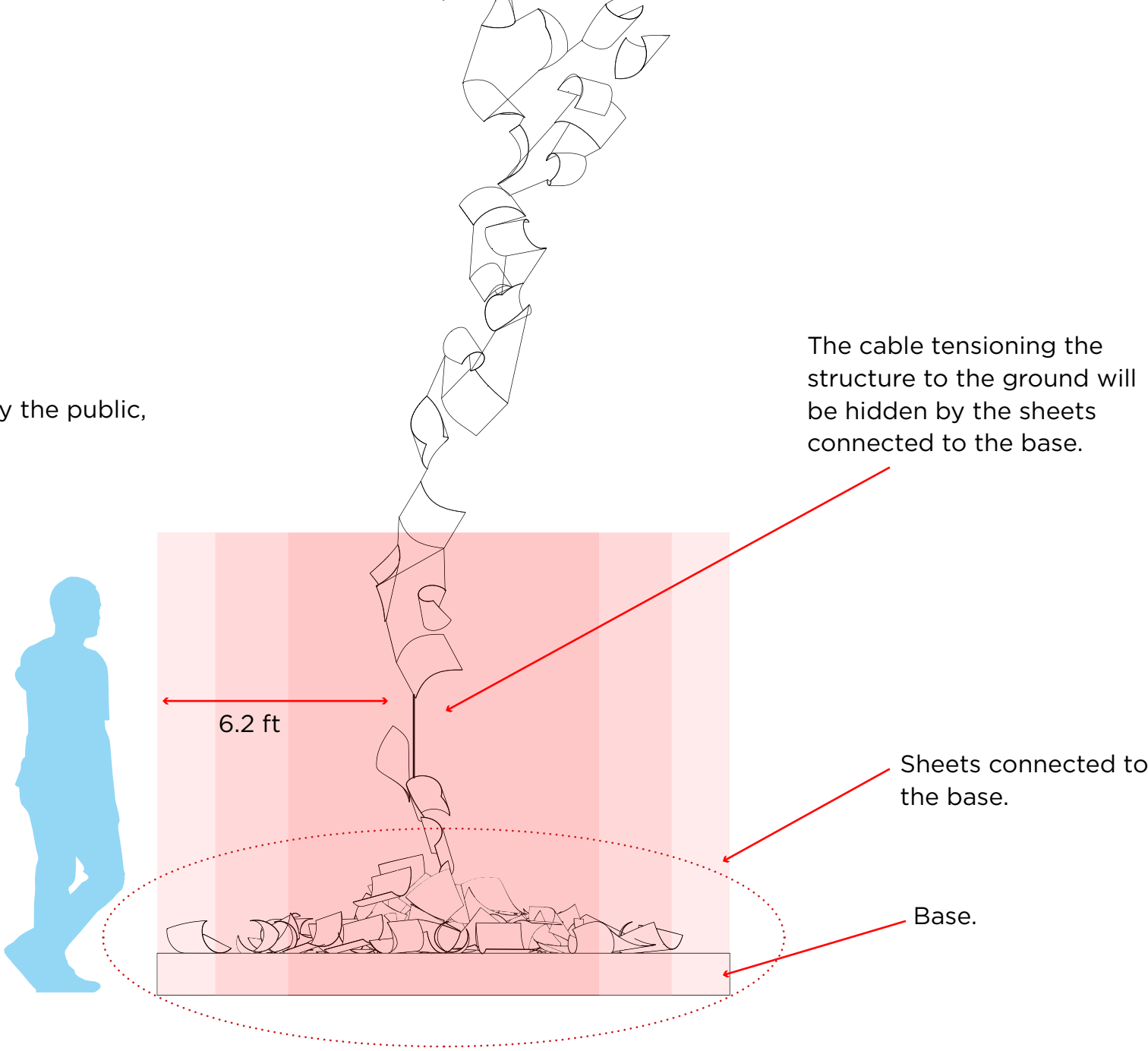
