A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, AUTHORIZING NORMAN DAY SCHOOL FOR HANDICAPPED CHILDREN D//B/A PROJECT OUTREACH AS PROJECT AGENT, UNDER THE SOCIAL AND VOLUNTARY SERVICES COMMISSION **CONTRACT** IN THE **AMOUNT** OF \$1.950 APPROVED TO BE USED SPECIFICALLY TO PURCHASE NEW TOYS AND SUPPLIES FOR THE PROGRAM.

- § 1. WHEREAS, the City of Norman, Oklahoma, does hereby acknowledge that the tax-exempt status of this political subdivision is a significant factor in determining the agreed contract for \$1,950 with Norman Day School for Handicapped Children d/b/a Project Outreach through the FYE 2015 Social and Voluntary Services Commission funding allocation; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, the City of Norman, Oklahoma, in compliance with State law, desires to confer Norman Day School for Handicapped Children d/b/a Project Outreach, its special State and Federal sales tax exemptions and in order to achieve such end, finds it necessary to appoint as its direct purchasing agent, Norman Day School for Handicapped Children d/b/a Project Outreach to purchase materials which are, in fact, incorporated in, and used specifically to purchase new toys and supplies for the program; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, this limited agent status is conferred with the express understanding, Norman Day School for Handicapped Children d/b/a Project Outreach shall appoint employees and subcontractors as subagents who shall be authorized to make purchases on their behalf.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA:

§ 4. That the City of Norman, Oklahoma, on the 28th day of October, 2014, did authorize Norman Day School for Handicapped Children d/b/a Project Outreach under the Social and Voluntary Services Commission contract in the amount of \$1,950, an agent of the City of Norman, Oklahoma, solely for the purpose of purchasing, on a tax-exempt basis, new toys and supplies for the program.
