Application Summary

The applicant, DG Central 1, is requesting Special Use for a Public Utility for a commercial ground-mounted solar photovoltaic system.

Neighbor's Comments/Concerns/Responses

Q: Will the applicant be removing trees?

A: A few immature cedars will be removed.

Q: What kind of fence will be put up?

A: A 6' chain link fence will be erected. There will be one foot of a security top, such as barbed wire. The fence will only be around the 15 acre portion of the 40 acre lot.

Q: Will there be a glare from the panels?

A: The panels will have a coating that prevents glare. Glare is bad for solar energy collection.

Q: Will the panels make any noise?

A: There will be no audible noise from a couple of hundred feet away. You might hear the transformer if you're close enough. The noise will mostly come during construction. There will be 2-3 weeks of pile driving and construction will take 2-3 months in total.

Q: Will there be light at night?

A: No, the only possible light is on a front gate sign if it is required by the City.

Q: Will there be a need to trench wire?

A: Usually the cables are suspended instead of buried.

Q: Is there a possibility of abandoning the site and it becoming an eye sore?

A: The agreement between all parties is for 30 years. Part of the lease requires decommissioning the site at the end of the lease.

Q: Will this development affect drainage?

A: Our projects usually improve drainage because of the grasses that are planted year-round.

Q: When are you hoping to begin the project?

A: We would like to start in September 2020 with an end of the year finish.

Q: Will this site have battery storage?

A: No.
