She said The Norman Transcript usually follows it up in the newspaper. She said these public meetings tell us where the citizens are and what they are concerned about.

*

Miscellaneous Discussion, continued:

Food and Shelter for Friends Thanksgiving Dinner. Councilmember Heiple said there were over 1,500 people served at the Food and Shelter For Friends Thanksgiving Dinner and not a single person stood in line. He thanked Food and Shelter for Friends for a job well done.

*

Shop Norman. Councilmembers Heiple and Quinn urged citizens to “Shop Norman”.

Councilmember Holman said if something can be purchased in Norman, he strongly encouraged everyone to do so, even if it might cost a little more. He said it was a way to save money on gasoline.

*

Cinnamon Run Neighborhood Meeting. Councilmember Miller announced there had been a neighborhood meeting in Cinnamon Run Addition located off of 72nd Avenue S.E. She thanked staff for their attendance. She said there were approximately 25 neighbors who attended and voiced concerns about the construction of gas and oil pipelines in the area. She said all of the construction taking place right is repairing old pipelines. She said this is not the Keystone Pipeline and nothing new is being run through the City. She said there were representatives from the Police and Fire Departments. She said people left the meeting feeling safer and knowing who they can call if they have questions.

*

Traffic Situation on Robinson and I-35. Councilmember Quinn said he witnessed an accident at the intersection of Crossroads Boulevard and Robinson on Monday, December 8th. He said he would like some type of update about the schedule of improvements at this intersection.

Mr. Shawn O’Leary, Director of Public Works, said he met with Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) Officials last week on an unrelated matter and the good news is that ODOT will be extending the corridor study to Robinson Street and is willing to endorse the City of Norman’s design concepts submitted a few months ago. He said the Community Planning and Transportation Committee reviewed and endorsed the preferred alternative to address the problem on Robinson at I-35. He said Staff is prepared to include the City’s application for additional funding for the interchange project at Robinson Street to the Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG) next week. He said if this goes through, the City could have the project funded and built in 2016.

*

City Council Oversight Committee Meeting. Councilmember Holman said discussion will continue regarding oil and gas regulations at the City Council Oversight Committee Meeting on Thursday, December 18th.

Mayor Rosenthal clarified that the Oversight Committee would not be discussing Fracking. She said issues related to fencing, insurance, and location of wells with respect to the watershed were the topics to be discussed.

*

New Tanker Trucks for the Fire Department. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, provided photographs of two new 3,000 gallon tanker trucks to be used primarily for rural area fires. He said the trucks were paid for with Public Safety Sales Tax. He said before these trucks were purchased, the Fire Department had one 1,500 gallon tanker. He said one will be deployed at Fire Station Eight and one will be used at Fire Station Nine. He said last year the Fire Department went through an Insurance Services Offices (ISO) review and with the addition of these new tankers, staff will be asking ISO to come back in 2015 and review Norman again to give the City the opportunity to lower the ISO rating in the rural areas from 9 to an improved number.

*

Update of Legacy Park. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, provided photographs of control vault around the pond foundation at Legacy Park and the trees that been planted on the Interstate frontage. He said over 100 trees had been planted within the last few weeks.

*

Miscellaneous Discussion, continued:

Sales Tax Report. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said the monthly sales tax check for December has been received which reflects collections made during the month of October. Sales tax is up 2.1% over 2013 levels and to date collections are approximately 3% above last year.

*

Accreditation. Mr. Steve Lewis, City Manager, said Monday, December 8th was the kickoff of the Public Works Department accreditation process where our department is compared to other Public Works Departments around the country. He said this process was done four years ago and at that time, the City of Norman was the only city in the State of Oklahoma to have achieved this. He said this a great opportunity to improve the performance of the department, it increases the professionalism throughout the department and give City employees and citizens a sense of pride that our employees take that high level of professionalism very seriously and the City wants to deliver the best services that we can.
