

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING SECTION 460 OF CHAPTER 22 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORMAN SO AS TO GRANT HISTORIC DISTRICT DESIGNATION ON A PORTION OF SOUTHRIDGE ADDITION, CLEVELAND COUNTY, OKLAHOMA; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SEVERABILITY THEREOF. (A TRACT OF LAND BOUNDED ON THE WEST BY THE RAILROAD TRACKS, ON THE SOUTH BY BROOKS STREET, ON THE EAST BY CLASSEN BOULEVARD, ON THE NORTH BY 1310 CLASSEN BOULEVARD, AND INCLUDING EARL SNEED PARK ON THE EAST SIDE OF CLASSEN BOULEVARD)

- § 1. WHEREAS, Paul Johnston, as agent and neighborhood representative for the Southridge Historic District and the owners of the hereinafter described property, have made application to have the property described below designated an Historic District overlay zoning district; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, the Historic District Commission of the City of Norman conducted a public hearing as required by law and recommended adoption of an ordinance designating the property described below as an Historic District overlay zoning district; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Norman conducted a public hearing as required by law and recommended adoption of an ordinance designating the property described below as an Historic District overlay zoning district; and
- § 4. WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Norman, Oklahoma has considered the application and determined that the application should be granted and an ordinance adopted designating the property described below as an Historic District overlay zoning district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA:

- § 5. That Section 460 of Chapter 22 of the Code of the City of Norman, Oklahoma, is hereby amended so as to place the following described property in zoning classification Historic District of the City of Norman

All of Block Eight (8), and Lots Five (5) through Forty-Six (46) of Block Nine (9), of Southridge Addition, City of Norman, Cleveland County, Oklahoma. Said tracts of land containing 4.25 acres, more or less.

§ 6. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
