1. Commercial Designation.

The Property is currently zoned C-1, LOCAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT, over its Lot 1. No change is sought for that area of the Property in its uses, as C-1 is still the desired use in the portion. The building setbacks will be modified as below in order to bring the building closer to the streetscape and embrace it as a more pedestrian focused use.

Lot 2 of the Property will be zoned C-1, EXCEPT that through the restrictions of this PUD, this portion of the Property will only be allowed to be improved as a commercial parking facility to serve the adjacent existing C-1 use on the eastern edge of the Property. Thus the parking that is abutting the Lindsey and Lahoma streets will be relocated over to the western side of the site, and will be increased slightly to 16 spaces. There are already 10 spaces on the site, thus it is an increase of only about 6 spaces.

No. outdoor smoking, barbequing, or cooking will be allowed on the property.

The business hours as open to the general public shall be restricted to be open no later than 10:30 p.m. on each day.

The size of the two trees on the western edge of the site will be double the size of trees that are shown on the site plan that would normally be required for R-1 zoning.

The following uses as found under C-1 zoning district shall be prohibited:

- 1. Automobile supply store
- 2. Child Care establishment
- 3. Hotel or motel
- 4. Outdoor courts for sports activity
