



Q2 Do you rent or own?




Q8 How often do you visit the public parks in this neighborhood?


Q9 How satisfied are you with the public parks in this neighborhood?

Q10 How well are the streets in this neighborhood maintained?



Q11 Overall, how safe do you feel in this neighborhood?



Q12 Overall, how clean is this neighborhood?




Q13 How promising is the future of this neighborhood?




Q21 What would be the best time for your household to attend a neighborhood meeting?
