# 3. THE STUDIO OF THE SOONER THEATRE

This initiative addresses the educational and service mission of the Sooner Theatre, by providing instructional activities for adults and children in performance related areas to include classes, camps, master classes and workshops.

The Studio of The Sooner Theatre is thriving! Currently, more than 730 students are participating or will participate in a camp or class at The Studio! It's hard to believe that just four years ago we were supplementing extra space. We traded space with the Norman Public Library and borrowed and rented space from the City of Norman Parks & Recreation Department including the Irving and Whittier Recreation Centers, Reeves Building, Rotary House and the Senior Citizens' Center. In addition we utilized space at All Saints Catholic School, Middle Earth, First Presbyterian Church and Norman Public Schools.

We are thankful to have our Studio downtown Norman in the hustle and bustle of the growing arts district. Our landlord has been quite supportive and donates to our organization. Our space at 227 E. Main Street, houses our classes, rehearsals for our productions, the majority of our summer camps, as well as storage for costumes and props. We are now utilizing the space for small performances and have had several rental inquiries as well. We feel our initial investment of \$50,000 for renovations, was well worth it!

The Studio offers 26 classes a week during the school year and 23 camps and classes during the summer. The Studio offers Acting I and II, Musical Theatre I and II, Intro to Musical Theatre, Theatre Dance, Tap I, II, and III, Ballet, Hip-Hop, Show Troupe, Broadway Kids, Broadway Bables 1 & 2, Claymation, Song Study/Audition Technique, private dance, private voice and group voice. We have also added three new production classes and one new production camp to the schedule, giving our students more opportunities to perform each year!

Last fiscal year's Studio productions included: All Shook Up, 101 Dalmatians, Good News, Footloose, Piggy Nation and The Wizard of Oz.

Our current Studio Season: Crazy For You, Jungle Book, The Little Mermaid, Cinderella, How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying and Seussical.

Our annual cost to run the Studio last year, including utilities, instructor fees, repairs, maintenance, and supplies was \$156,375. Pius, we gave a total of 43 scholarships at a value of \$15,255. This year to date, we have given 80 scholarships at a value of \$30,865!!! We are proud of our solid program and are currently addressing the Issues of our continued "growth" and the Impact it's having on our building.

Many of our students perform in the community for various events including roles in commercials and films. This past year, one of our Studio trained students, traveled to NYC for final calibacks for 3 Broadway shows, *Annie, Mary Poppins* and the new musical *Matilda*. We also had a student training in LA for pilot season. Twelve Studio students auditioned for and were selected to play the Munchkins and Winkies in the National Tour of *The Wizard Of Oz*, and we had several students featured as the kids in *The OKC Philiharmonic Christmas Show* for the past two years.

Last year, The Studio was selected to premier the new children's musical *Piggy Nation*! 20 atudents were selected and performed the Oklahoma and Southwest Premiere just 3 weeks ago. The L.A. based author Richard Rosser was here to work with the students and attended all 3 performances. This was quite a coup for The Sooner Theatre and the community of Norman. October of fiscal year 2012, The Sooner took a group of 80 to NYC to work with Broadway veterans including Anne L. Nathan, from the original Broadway cast of *Thoroughly Modern Millie*, Michelle Lookadoo, from the Broadway casts of *Mary Poppins* and *Anything Goes*, Jim Cooney and Marc Turninelli, in workshops including Tap, Vocal Performance, Auditioning, Make-up and Hair, and Musical Theatre Dance. While in NYC, these students also had the opportunity to see two Broadway shows, and gain a better understanding of the industry from the performers and professionals who live it. We have planned another trip for this October!

The Studio regularly hosts Master Classes and Workshops with Broadway performers and performers from National Tours. Past Master Classes Include performers from, Wicked, Cats, Will Rogers Follies, The Who's Tommy, The Phantom of The Opera, Hairspray, Legally Blonde, The Wizard of Oz, Memphis, West Side Story and The Addams Family. Last summer, we hosted liqual Theba from FOX's hit show GLEE. Tituss Burgess, who originated the role of Sebastian in the Broadway smash Disney's The Little Mermaid, has also worked with Studio students in vocal workshops, and we plan to bring him back this summer.

We also bring in leaders from our industry to work with the students. For example, college professors will visit our teen classes and discuss and answer questions about the transition from high school performing arts to college performing arts, as well as hold mock auditions to give the students an idea of what to expect.

### 4. SPECIAL EVENTS

The Sooner Theatre hosts an annual Murder Mystery Dinner and Show, which raised a total of \$13,000 toward operations leat year. For this year's event we have already received \$10,000 in sponsorships, and the food has been completely donated. Projected totals thus far are at \$20,000!

### 5. RENTAL ACTIVITIES

Community organizations and individuals have the opportunity to rent the theatre for their activities, meetings or performances. Our renters are important to our survival. Our Rental revenue for 2011-2012 was \$15,548.

# 6. OUTREACH AND DEVELOPMENT

In addition to our programming, The Sooner staff is deeply rooted in the community. We have staff members who hold Board of Director seats or committee positions for several Norman organizations. We also provide entertainment for community events in Norman and neighboring communities, including matinee performances for Norman Public Schools, plus we keep our doors open for all Downtown related events.

#### STAFFING

Our mission, function and program direction have, each year, been approved by the City administration, and Municipal money has been provided for The Sooner to have a firm "base" for staffing the facility, and on which to build it's activities. According to Theatre Facts, A Report on Practices and Performances in the American Nonprofit Theatre, a typical theatre our size, with a similar County population count, and the same amount of programming will have 8-10 fulf time employees. Our current staff manages both the Sooner Theatre and The Studio of The Sooner Theatre with 6 full-time employees and 1 part-time employee. We also utilize the Federal Work Study program at OU, providing one student at 20 hrs a week.

This current The Studio will contract 40 instructors, 7 choreographers, 5 accompanists, 6 counselors, and numerous musicians.

Our board of directors provides benefits to our employees through Blue Cross Blue Shield of Oklahoma. As you know, the turnover rate in the "nonprofit world" has always been high, and it's even higher in the "theatre world, so offering benefits to our theatre employees is an incredible feat for our organization. This past fiscal year we paid \$13,216 in Health Insurance costs.

The Municipal money we receive in the amount of \$65,274 is paying for approximately 33.5% of our payroll expenses. (2011-2012)

We are now paying 20% of our total utility costs, which through December of 2012 totaled \$2800.

## OTHER SOURCES OF INCOME

In addition to the Municipal money our other sources of income are from our annual Murder Mystery Fundralser, Sponsorships, Donations, Program Advertising, Rentals, Grants, and our camps and classes. All of these help cover our current operating budget of approximately \$687.104

Our product tells what we stand for, what we want to offer the community and how well we know our business. At The Sooner Theatre we host professional artists to first-timers and foster performers from 3 years old on up.
