A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, COMMENDING AND EXTENDING RECOGNITION TO THE NORMAN FIRE DEPARTMENT ON THEIR 125TH ANNIVERSARY.

- WHEREAS, the citizens of Norman recognized the need for effective fire protection in the early 1890's; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, fire protection began with an ordinance in 1893 that required each business in town to maintain at least one (1) barrel of water for firefighting; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, Norman suffered its first fire loss on January 27, 1894, when the Wilson Cottage on East Main Street burned; and
- § 4. WHEREAS, on April 17, 1894, the first Norman Fire Department was formed; and
- § 5. WHEREAS, the new volunteer department had 33 members and G.W. Tackett was elected Fire Chief; and
- § 6. WHEREAS, Pabst Brewing Company and Anheuser-Busch Brewing Company were asked to help fund the much-needed fire apparatus and each contributed \$200 to allow Norman to acquire the "Pabst Hook and Ladder Truck #1 with the motto "Victory" and the "Anheuser-Busch Hose Cart #1 with the motto "Get There"; and
- § 7. WHEREAS, the Norman Fire Department has changed quite a bit since those early days from a town site with 500 people to a city of 196 square miles, a population of approximately 115,000 people, and nine (9) fire stations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA:

§ 8. That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Norman commend and recognize the Norman Fire Department on their 125th Anniversary.
