I am dismayed to think that the land in question will be developed in any way other than as a narrow strip park. The land in question is backed by a long stretch of creek which, within a short distance, also flows adjacent to our cul de sac. At that point the creek has maintenance problems already, with severe washing on one resident's land, and accumulation of dirt piles in the center of the creek bed which obstruct water flow. Paving this land would damage the creek further.

Also, I am dismayed at the probable increase in congestion in an area of 36th St. that is now often clogged and unmanageable. There is no solution for easy traffic flow from that land strip. I am sure the residents directly to the south would not be happy with the noise, parked cars, and other offshoots of commercial development as well. I know I would not want it in my back yard.

But the worse possible outcome from this proposed commercial development would be the destruction of the habitat for the numerous animals and birds that find the creek area a wonderful home. I have had a blue heron who lives there perch on my roof top and walk across my neighbor's meadow. Foxes live and breed in the area. Our bird population in this vicinity of Norman is really wonderful and much of it depends on the wooded creek habitat for survival. I'm sure there are other species there as well.

This is greed, pure and simple, at the cost to other Norman residents. The land strip is so narrow and so much of the creek will be ruined, it boggles the mind that anyone would even propose building on it. I hope the council has the foresight to turn this request down. I hope the owner donates it to the city for use as a park.
