SPECIAL ELECTION PROCLAMATION AND NOTICE

Under and by virtue of Sections 27 and 35 of Article X, of the Oklahoma Constitution and the Statutes of the State of Oklahoma, and Acts complementary, supplementary, and enacted pursuant thereto, the Charter of The City of Norman, Oklahoma (the "City"), as amended, and Ordinance Nos. O-1819-25, O-1819-26, and O-1819-28, each dated January 22, 2019, authorizing the calling of an election on the propositions hereinafter set forth, I, the undersigned Mayor of The City of Norman, Oklahoma, hereby call a special election and give notice thereof to be held in The City of Norman, Oklahoma, on the 2nd day of April, 2019, for the purpose of submitting to the registered, qualified voters in said City the following propositions:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

Transportation Bond Projects

Shall The City of Norman, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its general obligation bonds in the sum of Seventy Two Million Dollars (\$72,000,000) to provide funds for the purpose of constructing, widening, and improving streets and bridges in said City (including signage/signalization, lighting, sidewalks/bikepaths, landscaping, related drainage improvements, driveway reconstruction, and other related improvements), to be completed with or without the use of other funds, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percentum (10%) per annum, payable semi-annually and to become due within twenty-five (25) years from their date?

The voting machines or devices used at said election shall set out the proposition as above set forth and shall also contain the words:

PROPOSITION NO. 2

Stormwater Bond Projects

Shall The City of Norman, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its general obligation limited tax bonds in the sum of Sixty Million Dollars (\$60,000,000) for the purpose of economic and community development in said City, to include constructing, improving, and equipping stormwater drainage facilities, to be completed with or without the use of other funds, and levy and collect a special annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of fourteen percentum (14%) per annum, payable semi-annually and to become due within thirty (30) years from their date; provided however, that in no event shall the real and personal taxable property in said City be subject to a special annual tax in excess of five mills on the dollar for all bonds issued pursuant to Section 35, Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution?

The voting machines or devices used at said election shall set out the proposition as above set forth and shall also contain the words:



PROPOSITION NO. 3

Stormwater Utility Fee

Shall Ordinance O-1819-27 of the Council of the City of Norman, Oklahoma, adding Section 21-118 of Chapter 21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Norman, Oklahoma, which establishes the monthly rates to fund a Stormwater Utility as follows: \$3.00 for residential property with a first floor living area less than or equal to 1,196 square feet; \$6.00 for residential property with a first floor living area of 1,197 to 1,983 square feet; \$9.00 for residential property with a first floor living area greater than 1,983 square feet; providing for a 30% reduction in the rate for qualifying low-income residences; \$12.00 for non-residential property that has a parcel area between 0.63 and 2.11 acres; \$80.00 for non-residential property that has a parcel area between 2.12 acres and 13.97 acres; \$160.00 for non-residential property that has a parcel area between 2.12 acres and 13.97 acres; be approved?

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECTS AND USE OF PROCEEDS

(Proposition No. 1)

Transportation Bond Projects

The Transportation Projects for which the proceeds of the aforesaid not to exceed \$72,000,000 general obligation bonds shall be expended consist of constructing, widening, and improving streets and bridges in the City (including signage/signalization, lighting, sidewalks/bikepaths, landscaping, related drainage improvements, driveway reconstruction, and other related improvements), including but not limited to those streets and bridges listed below. Related improvements could include, but not by way of limitation, easement acquisition, utility relocation, new curb and gutter and driveway approaches, signage/signalization, striping, and landscaping. The costs of the projects are based on engineering estimates, with engineering to be completed as the bonds are issued and with the improvements to be made as needed. Said projects may be accomplished through participation with other governmental agencies and others, and may be accomplished in phases. The specific projects for which at least seventy percent (70%) of the proceeds of the aforesaid bonds shall be expended and the dollar amount of each such project shall be as follows:

(Proposition No. 2)

Stormwater Bond Projects

The Storm Drainage Projects for which the proceeds of the aforesaid not to exceed \$60,000,000 general obligation limited tax bonds shall be expended shall be limited to qualified economic and community development purposes as defined in Title 62, Section 802 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to include constructing, improving, and equipping stormwater drainage facilities. The projects may be accomplished through participation with other governmental agencies and others, and may be accomplished in phases. Project costs include related construction testing, inspection, project implementation and administration, planning, permitting, engineering and design, right of way and real property acquisition. The City has identified specific projects through the development of its Storm Water Master Plan, along with preliminary cost estimates for each such project. The following projects have been identified for funding from the proceeds of the aforesaid bonds; provided however, to the extent any project may be completed for less than the specified amount (with or without other funding sources), any surplus funds shall be utilized first to complete the other identified projects and second to complete other projects as may be identified from time to time in the Storm Water Master Plan:
