A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, DONATING USED BODY ARMOR AND OTHER SURPLUS EQUIPMENT TO THE JONES, OKLAHOMA, POLICE DEPARTMENT.

- § 1. WHEREAS, Sec. 8-302(a) of the Norman City Code requires all sales of surplus or obsolete supplies, materials, or equipment to be made through competitive bidding at public auction in person and/or on-line; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, Sec. 8-302(b)(3) of the Norman City Code excepts the above requirement of competitive bidding or public auction of the surplus or obsolete supplies, materials or equipment that the Council chooses by resolution to donate to other Municipalities or not-for-profit agencies; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, the City of Norman Police Department desires to donate used body armor and other surplus equipment to the Jones, Oklahoma, Police Department; and
- § 4. WHEREAS, the City of Norman provides body armor to every commissioned police officer, which is replaced every five years on industry recommendations and union contract; and
- § 5. WHEREAS, the used body armor is generally destroyed or used for ballistic testing and cannot be resold or returned; and
- § 6. WHEREAS, there has been a request from the Jones, Oklahoma, Police Department for any used body armor or other surplus equipment such as Taser holsters, pistol holsters, pepper spray pouches, handcuff cases, flashlight loops, magazine pouches, batons with holders, radio case, over and under belts and keepers; and
- § 7. WHEREAS, the value of the thirteen (13) used sets of body armor is \$100-\$200 per set or approximately \$1,300 to \$2,600; and
- § 8. WHEREAS, the value of the four (4) Taser holsters, five (5) pistol holsters, nineteen (19) pepper spray pouches, eighteen (18) handcuff cases, four (4) flashlight loops, twenty (20) magazine pouches, four (4) batons with holders, one (1) radio case, seven (7) over belts, eight (8) under belt and eighty-six (86) keepers is estimated at two to three hundred dollars (\$200-\$300); and

§ 9. WHEREAS, these items are all used and not eligible for return to the vendor.

§ 10. THAT the City of Norman Police Department donate the used body armor and other surplus equipment to the Jones, Oklahoma Police Department.
