A PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, PROCLAIMING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 2021, AS BLACK HISTORY MONTH IN THE CITY OF NORMAN.

- § 1. WHEREAS, since its origin in 1926 as Black History Week, we have paused to reflect on the many contributions of our African-American citizens that enrich our nation, state, and community; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, 2021's national theme, "The Black Family: Representation, Identity, and Diversity," recognizes the black family diaspora and complexity of being reverenced, stereotyped, and even vilified from the days of slavery to our own time. The black family offers a rich tapestry of images for exploring the African American past and present; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, the influence and accomplishments of African-American citizens have contributed to our community in all aspects of life and have continued to help make Norman a safe, thriving, and vibrant community; and
- § 4. WHEREAS, the City of Norman continues to strive to become a more inclusive community providing all residents the right to human dignity, justice, and the opportunity to live life fully and achieve their aspirations; and
- § 5. WHEREAS, the Norman Human Rights Commission continues to work to dispel prejudice and discrimination, and to advance fairness, mutual understanding, and appreciation for the worth of all people.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA:

§ 6. Do hereby proclaim the month of February, 2021, as Black History Month in the City of Norman and invite all citizens to join me in celebrating the diversity and character of our community.
